DAVE POHL – CLINTON COUNTY COMMISSIONER

Dave Pohl – Clinton County Commissioner sent correspondence outlining the following issues:

- A preliminary budget was discussed at a special meeting Sept 12th. The board approved adding 2 additional positions to the uniform division above the 1 that the Sheriff had requested. This adds 1 to each shift which enhances the safety of the road patrol and better availability for public safety. The Sheriff spoke of his desire to create a stronger presence in the schools. The pension fund and the retiree health care fund continue in a well-funded position. The proposed budget is 4.5% to 5% increase from the 2024 revised budget.
- Facility maintenance issues include the in-floor heating repairs @ \$30,000 and a new generator for the Courthouse @ \$1,060,000. This new generator will operate the whole Courthouse. The previous system was designed to maintain the 911 system with little additional capacity.
- Approved the 2025 agreement for Extension Service provided by Michigan State University at a 3% increase.
- Discussion was held on reestablishing the Farmland Preservation Committee. No action taken.
- Adopted an ordinance to amend regulations for medical hardship housing and regulate accessory dwelling units.
- Adopted an ordinance to amend regulations for mineral extraction use by special land use.
